RETURN TO AUSTRALIA.

Fremantle, May 31. Mr. Ernest Genomi, who was farming in Western Australia for three years before the outbreak of the war, and who 3, his enlisted with the A.I.F. and went to France with the 16th Battalion, returned to Western Australia in the Italian men steamer Citta di Genova, which reached Fremantle to-day. 




