


The German Case Study

Particularities DIE KOOPERATIVE

Common

... distinguishes itself by its legal form of being a cooperative.

Community Supported
Agriculture (CSA)





... bundles the produce of a regional cooperation network of farms providing food for its members.

Growth and profit orientation



... limits its member size to an optimum where the generated turnover is enough to cover costs, to make reinvestments and to pay aboveaverage wages.

Financial CSA-mechanism: bidding rounds



... started with fixed prices for the crop shares to avoid financial risks. Now as its financial situation is stable, the cooperative's price mechanism is ideologically fine-tuned, together with their members, of course!
